
## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 2009, the Loess Hills National Scenic Byway Council contracted with Western Hills Resources to complete a Recreation Plan Study of the Loess Hills. Funding for this project was provided by the Iowa Department of Economic Development (IDED) and the Iowa West Foundation. IDED recognized the need to create a recreation corridor to compliment existing opportunities in both the Loess Hills and Missouri River.

The study was completed in several stages:

1. Host introductory partner meetings—Partner meetings were held in fall of 2009 in Glenwood, Pisgah and Sioux City. Participants were asked to review and correct an initial inventory of existing recreational sites in the Loess Hills. The initial inventory was also sent out to County Conservation Boards and other partner organizations for review.
2. Develop Geographic Information System (GIS) maps and layers—GIS maps are an integral component of the study. The Pottawattamie County GIS Department created maps using the information collected. The maps are included in this study.
3. Identify plans and proposed developments with partners—The study team asked participants to share future recreation development plans. The team specifically looked at projects that were proposed to begin within the next five years. Also included was the plan for the Lewis and Clark Multi-Use Trail, which is one of the five significant bicycle trails identified statewide by the Iowa DOT that could be completed in the next 20 years.
4. Prioritize strategic connections between cities and counties— Identifying these connections will allow the Loess Hills National Scenic Byway Council to solicit funding possibilities, allowing for more recreation facilities and the development of the Loess Hills as a recreation destination.

This Recreation Plan identified and prioritized development potential for outdoor recreation facilities and amenities to assist in marketing the assets of the Loess Hills.



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
## INTRODUCTION

The Loess Hills of western Iowa are truly an American treasure. The landscape stretches from the southwestern point of Iowa past Hamburg to just north of Sioux City in Plymouth County. In only one other part of the world, the Loess Plateau of central China, has loess soil accumulated to such depths to allow for the dramatic narrow ridges and steep side slopes that define the Loess Hills.

Loess, pronounced “luss,” is a German word meaning loose or crumbly. This rich soil is found throughout the United States, but is only found in such significant depths in western Iowa. “They are hills made almost entirely of windblown soils. Toward the end of the last ice age, winds picked up soils that had been ground as fine as flour and formed dunes along the ancient waterway that became today’s Missouri River. The process repeated itself during the thousands of years the ice age took to end, enlarging the dunes. Because the prevailing winds were from the northwest, the dunes on the Iowa side of the river were higher than those west of the Missouri.

Today, the definition of a Loess Hill is a hill made of loess that is more than 60 feet in height; using that definition, about 640,000 acres of land in western Iowa constitute the Loess Hills landform” (LHNSB Visitor Guidebook, p. 2).

Iowa’s Loess Hills are of such significance that in 2002 the National Park Service completed *The Loess Hills of Western Iowa Special Resource Study and Environmental Assessment*. The 220-mile long landform is complemented by the Loess Hills National Scenic Byway which skirts the landscape in parts, and takes travelers up to the top of the hills in others. The Byway was first designated a National Scenic Byway in 2000, based on its natural intrinsic quality. The Byway Council will be pursuing an All American Road designation in the next round of Byway nominations. The Byway and the landform provide myriad opportunities for visitors to take advantage of outdoor recreation in the Loess Hills.

## THE LOESS HILLS RECREATION PLAN

The Loess Hills Recreation Plan Study was commissioned by Golden Hills Resource Conservation and Development (RC&D) in 2009 to update the existing Loess Hills National Scenic Byway Corridor Management Plan (CMP). Funding for the study was made possible through grants from the Iowa Department of Economic Development and the Iowa West Foundation.

The Loess Hills CMP was originally completed in 1997 in preparation for the Byway Council's application for National Scenic Byway designation, and was in need of an update. The Byway Council decided to update the CMP in sections, linking separate components to complete one comprehensive management plan. Most recently, GIS resource mapping, the land use section, a marketing plan and this recreation plan have been updated or added.

In conjunction with the Byway Council's work to update the Loess Hills CMP, the Iowa Department of Economic Development agreed that a recreation plan would enhance or complete a comprehensive plan for Iowa's Loess Hills Region. The original recreation portion of the CMP inventoried the national, state, county parks and private preserves in the Loess Hills region. This study captures a more complete picture of recreation opportunities in the Loess Hills. In addition to updating the previous list, this study identified trails, city parks and private recreation facilities such as golf courses, shooting ranges, etc.

The purpose of this Recreation Plan Study is fourfold:

1. Update the inventory of existing national, state, county and private recreation opportunities in the Loess Hills.
2. Identify future recreation opportunities in the Loess Hills.
3. Prioritize recreational linkages and opportunities to take advantage of federal, state, local and private grant sources to fund projects that increase the availability of recreation in the Loess Hills region.
4. Increase public access to the Loess Hills by developing recreation facilities for residents and to attract more visitors as a way to increase tourism based economic development.

## PROFILES

## REGIONAL PROFILE

The Loess Hills run parallel to the Missouri River along the western border of Iowa. The Byway Counties of Fremont, Mills, Pottawattamie, Harrison, Monona, Woodbury and Plymouth are defined by their unique topography and natural resources.

The Loess Hills region is largely rural, with the largest Metropolitan Statistical Areas being those of Sioux City in Woodbury County and Council Bluffs in Pottawattamie County.

## GEOGRAPHIC PROFILE

Located on the western edge of Iowa, the Loess Hills region was officially designated a Special Landscape Area by the National Park Service in 2002. The deep loess deposits that form the landscape are only found at such depths in one other place in the world: the loess plateau of northwest China. The deep loess soils in Iowa form a north-south band approximately 200 miles along the eastern edge of the Missouri River, and cover approximately 640,000 acres of land.

For a resource to be considered nationally significant, it must meet the following criteria as set forth by the National Park Service:

- It must be an outstanding example of a particular type of resource;
- It must possess exceptional value or quality in illustrating or interpreting the natural or cultural themes of our nation's heritage;
- It must offer superlative opportunities for public use and enjoyment, or for scientific study;
- It must retain a high degree of integrity as a true, accurate, and relatively unspoiled example of the resource.


"The steep, sharply ridged topography of the Loess Hills is the product of tens of thou-

sands of years of deposition and erosion of this wind-blown silt. The rugged landscape and strong local contrasts in weather and soil conditions provide refuge for a number of rare plants and animals, many of which can be found in Iowa only in the Loess Hills" (Mutel 4-5, 1989).

The Loess Hills' intricately sculptured loess deposits have been described as "the best example of loess topography not only in the Central Lowlands, but in the United States." (NPS, 1985). This striking landform is an outstanding example of a landscape formed by two fundamental geological processes – wind and erosion.

## **NATURAL PROFILE**

Many of the Loess Hills' special natural qualities lie within the region's upland prairies. Native prairie, once widespread across the Midwest, has been reduced to less than one percent of its original extent in Iowa (Ott 2-3, 1995). The Loess Hills contain most of Iowa's remaining

native prairie, including the largest expanses of undisturbed prairie in the state. Because of the protected grasslands found in the Loess Hills, the region is able to provide habitat for a large number of rare flora and fauna found nowhere else in the state. The intact prairies are large enough to still hold viable populations of the Ottoe skipper (*Hesperia ottoe*), and the Regal fritillary (*Speyeria idalia*), grassland butterfly obligates. Grassland birds, including the


sharp tailed grouse, also find refuge in the grasslands in the Loess Hills.

Two of Iowa's seven National Natural Landmarks are located in the Loess Hills. Administered by the National Park Service, the National Natural Landmark program recognizes outstanding examples of biological and geological features found in the United States. The Turin site is located in Monona County near the city of Turin and occupies 7,440 acres. The Little Sioux-Smith Lake site is located in northern Harrison County and occupies approximately 2,980 acres.

## DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE

Seven counties comprise the Loess Hills region: Plymouth, Woodbury, Monona, Harrison, Pottawattamie, Mills and Fremont. From 1990 to 2008, the region experienced an increase in population growth from 250,484 to 263,276 for a percent change of 2.07%. However, Monona and Fremont Counties experienced a population decrease of 10.6% and 9.4%, respectively. In comparison, population for the State of Iowa grew 8.13% from 2,776,755 to 3,002,555.

There are two Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA) located in the Loess Hills Region: Omaha/Council Bluffs MSA (comprising the counties of Cass, NE; Douglas, NE; Harrison, IA; Mills, IA; Pottawattamie, IA; Sarpy, NE; Saunders, NE; and Washington, NE); and Sioux City MSA (comprising the counties of Dakota, NE; Dixon, NE; Union, SD; and Woodbury, IA). The combined population for these two MSAs is 981,082. From 1990 to 2008, these MSAs grew 29% in population from 733,280 to 981,082.



## POPULATION BY AGE

For the Loess Hills Counties, statistics demonstrate a 4% increase in the 20-64 year-old age group, with slight decreases in all other age groups. The 20-64 year-old age group is also the largest, claiming more than 50% of the population. These are indicators that recreation opportunities should be targeted at this demographic.

## ECONOMIC PROFILE

An economic profile of the Loess Hills reveals that, when adjusted for inflation, the earned income for most households has risen approximately 1.5% from 1990 to 2000. The median income for households in the Loess Hills region was \$38,509 in 2000. When adjusted for inflation the median income for households in the Loess Hills region was \$37,942 in 1990. Monona County had the lowest median income per household at \$33,235 in 2000, while Mills County had the highest median income per household at \$42,428.


For the state of Iowa, the median income for households in 2000 was \$39,469 and in 1990 the median income for households was \$26,229 (\$35,304 when adjusted for inflation).

## 2009 IOWA WELCOME CENTERS SURVEY

The Iowa Department of Tourism conducts an annual welcome center survey to gauge traveler interest and spending trends. The most recent 2009 survey found that of those travelers with an interest in outdoor recreation in Iowa, the average travel party stayed four and a half days in the state and spent \$228.32 per day. Therefore, the average travel party spends approximately \$1004 per trip in Iowa. 80% of outdoor recreation travelers were there for vacation and leisure or to visit friends and relatives. Their spending goes to transportation, lodging, food, entertainment and shopping. Capturing a larger share of this funding in the Loess Hills region should be a priority. In addition, offering a greater number and wider variety of recreation opportunities in the region would entice travelers to extend their stay.

## CURRENT RECREATION RESOURCES


The Loess Hills Landform Region is home to myriad and varied recreational opportunities. Existing recreational activities include, but are not limited to:

- Auto-touring
- Hiking
- Picnicking

- Horseback riding

Many of these activities are available at the national, state, county and city owned parks and facilities that lie in and near the landform.

### **National Parks**

DeSoto National Wildlife Refuge is located in the Missouri Valley Flood Plain and is one of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's most outstanding facilities. The refuge is primarily protected to serve as a stopover area for migratory ducks and geese. Each spring and fall, hundreds of thousands of geese and ducks make a stopover at the more than 8,500 acre site. A visitor center and museum at the Refuge interprets important natural, cultural and historic resources of the region.
