Iowa West Public Art Collection

Council Bluffs' artistic energy is a yet another reason this community continues to inspire — and attract — residents and visitors alike.

It's no accident. Beginning in 2004 and sparked by the vision of a dynamic cultural future, Iowa West Foundation made the commitment to build what has become Iowa's most significant and accessible public art collection, right here on the banks of the Missouri River.

This collection, which includes internationally-known public art superstars, American icons and fresh local talent, rivals major public art installations across the nation.

And it is everywhere. Unlike most collections, the Iowa West Public Art Collection lives with us and among us, enhancing the everyday experiences of those who live here, those who pass through and those who journey here specifically to explore and experience the art.

Understanding Yesterday & Imagining Tomorrow

Historic installations, including Daniel Chester French's extraordinary "Black Angel," placed high above the city as it emerged, and Grant Wood's mural depictions of the area's early growth and development, continue to act as points of local pride and as a catalyst for ongoing efforts to build art into daily life here.

The recent Art in the Park program brought together artists and neighborhood residents in a collaborative process. This series of site-specific signs, created by seven local artists to honor Council Bluffs' robust historic park system, is breathing new life into the community for the next generation of park enthusiasts.





