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# Introduction

In 2013, Wilder Research was contracted by United Way of the Midlands, Omaha Community Foundation, and Iowa West Foundation to conduct a community assessment in Douglas and Sarpy counties in Nebraska and Pottawattamie County in Iowa, which cover the Omaha / Council Bluffs metropolitan area and the service areas of the three participating organizations. The results of the assessment will be used to help design each organization's individual work plan and collective efforts to address the community's needs over the next decade.

This study used three primary methods to gather information from community members:

- First, this study used a mailed survey with a representative sample of residents who live in Douglas, Sarpy, and Pottawattamie counties. Nearly 900 residents completed this survey.
- Second, this assessment included a web survey (the same instrument used for the mailed survey) that was available to any interested community member to opt in. Nearly 1,800 residents completed this survey.
- Third, four community conversations were held in different locations throughout the community, including The Jewish Federation of Omaha in West Omaha, the Lakin Campus in Council Bluffs, Omaha North High School in North Omaha, and the Kroc Center in South Omaha. Residents who participated in the community conversations completed the same paper survey that was used for the representative mailed survey. Participants also voted on various questions using Audience Polling Technology and provided their feedback through small group and large group discussions.

This study also used several secondary data sources to provide more context and triangulation for the findings, including the U.S. Census and American Community Survey data, the Annie E. Casey Foundation's "KIDS COUNT" database, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's "County Health Rankings & Roadmaps" database, the Nebraska and Iowa Departments of Education, the Nebraska Crime Commissions report, the Iowa Department of Public Safety, the United Way of the Midlands' "Strategic Planning Indicators" data compilation, and the United Way of the Midlands' "Greater Omaha Human Care Profile" report.

# Methods

## Representative mailed survey of residents

### *Survey instrument*

The survey instrument was designed by Wilder Research in collaboration with the participating organizations. Previous surveys conducted by Wilder and the participating organizations were also used as examples when designing the survey. The survey was developed in English and the final instrument was translated into Spanish. See the Appendix for the English and Spanish versions of the survey instrument.

### *Sample*

Address-based sampling was used to select a representative sample of households in each of the three counties. The sample was purchased from Marketing Systems Group. See below for an illustration of the number of addresses sampled, number of completed surveys, response rate, and margin of error for each of the three counties.

### *Data collection*

Most of the sampled addresses (n=7,500) were contacted three times by mail, using the “modified Dillman” method of survey mailing, whereby sampled addresses are sent an initial survey packet including a cover letter, survey, and postage-paid return envelope. After two weeks, all households that did not return their completed survey were sent a post card reminder. After an additional two weeks, all sampled households that still did not complete the survey were sent a final survey packet. The remaining 1,500 sampled addresses

received one mailing, which was sent at the same time as the third mailings from the initial sample.

### ***Weighting and analysis***

These survey data were weighted to produce reliable estimates of population parameters. The weighting process also compensates for practical limitations of a sample survey, such as differential nonresponse and under-coverage. By taking advantage of demographic information about the target population, weighting reduces the variability of survey estimates.

The weighting process entails three steps. The first step consists of the computation of *design* or *base weights* to reflect any differential selection based on number of adults in the sampled household. In the second step, base weights are adjusted so that the resulting weights can aggregate to reported totals for the target population. For this study, survey weights were calculated using the method of *Iterative Proportional Fitting*, which is commonly referred to as *Raking*. Finally, adjusted weights are put through a series of quality control checks to detect extreme outliers and to prevent any computational or procedural errors.

Given the sample size and the demographic composition of the adult population of the three county area, design weights were adjusted by age and gender. Survey data for these demographic questions included missing values. All such missing values were first imputed using a hot-deck procedure before construction of the survey weights. The data were weighted against the U.S. Census Bureau's March Supplement of the Current Population Survey (CPS) 2012.

Coding was completed to categorize responses to the open-ended questions. See the Appendix for the codebook.

### **Opt-in web survey**

#### ***Survey instrument***

The survey instrument used for the web survey is the same as the instrument used for the representative mailed survey of residents. See the Appendix for the paper versions of the English and Spanish survey. Wilder Research programmed and maintained the web survey using our web survey software, Results for Research, from Ronin Corporation.

## ***Participants***

United Way of the Midlands, Omaha Community Foundation, and Iowa West Foundation advertised this community assessment and the web survey option extensively.

As a result of this extensive advertising, a total of 1,784 community members completed the survey, including 1,760 in English and 24 in Spanish.

## ***Analysis***

These survey respondents opted in to this survey, so caution must be used when interpreting the results, since typically people who have stronger opinions about an issue are more likely than the average resident to participate in these types of surveys. However, because this particular opt-in web survey was widely advertised, and because of the large number of responses received from community members, the responses from this web survey were given serious attention in the overall analysis and development of issues to consider and recommendations. Specifically, because such a wide variety of community members opted-in to this survey, weight is given to the highest ranked items on lists as well as the most commonly mentioned issues in open-ended questions, especially when the themes from this survey can be triangulated with those from the web survey and community conversations. The same codebook was used to analyze the open-ended responses for the web survey and the mailed survey (see the Appendix).

## **Community conversations**

In June 2013, United Way of the Midlands, Omaha Community Foundation, and Iowa West Foundation convened four community conversations for the purposes of gathering more in-depth information from community members on the topics of the assessment and to encourage broad participation among typically under-represented segments of the community. The partner organizations were responsible for the facilities, food, child care, AV equipment, participant registration and incentives, and other event logistics. Wilder Research facilitated these sessions using a combination of methods: survey, audience polling, and in-depth discussion using specialized facilitation techniques.



## *Participants*

Overall, 414 community members attended a community conversation.

## *Survey*

The survey instrument used for the community conversations is the same as the instrument used for the representative mailed survey of residents. See the Appendix for the paper versions of the English and Spanish survey. All community conversation participants were invited to complete a survey at the beginning of each event, during the dinner. (Participants who had already completed the web survey or mailed survey were asked not to complete it again at the event.)

Community members at the last two events were also given information about the web survey and were asked to tell their friends and family members about the web survey.

## *Audience polling*

Wilder Research used our audience polling technology to gather additional quantitative information from community conversation participants. The polling questions were designed to gather more information about the topics of focus for the community assessment as well as to encourage further conversation on these topics. See the Appendix for the community conversation polling questions.

## *Small and large group discussion and blue wall*

Wilder Research used a “blue wall” facilitation technique and other large and small group facilitation methods to encourage participants to engage deeply with the topics at hand and to provide more in-depth and qualitative nuance to the quantitative data that has been gathered through the multiple modes of survey administration. The “blue wall” is a large sticky wall where participants’ ideas, that they have jotted down on half-sheets of paper,

can be displayed, organized, and categorized into themes, that the facilitators then used to discuss and probe for more depth with participants. The detailed discussion guide used by the facilitators, as well as the worksheets participants used for their smaller group discussions, are included in the Appendix.

### *Analysis*

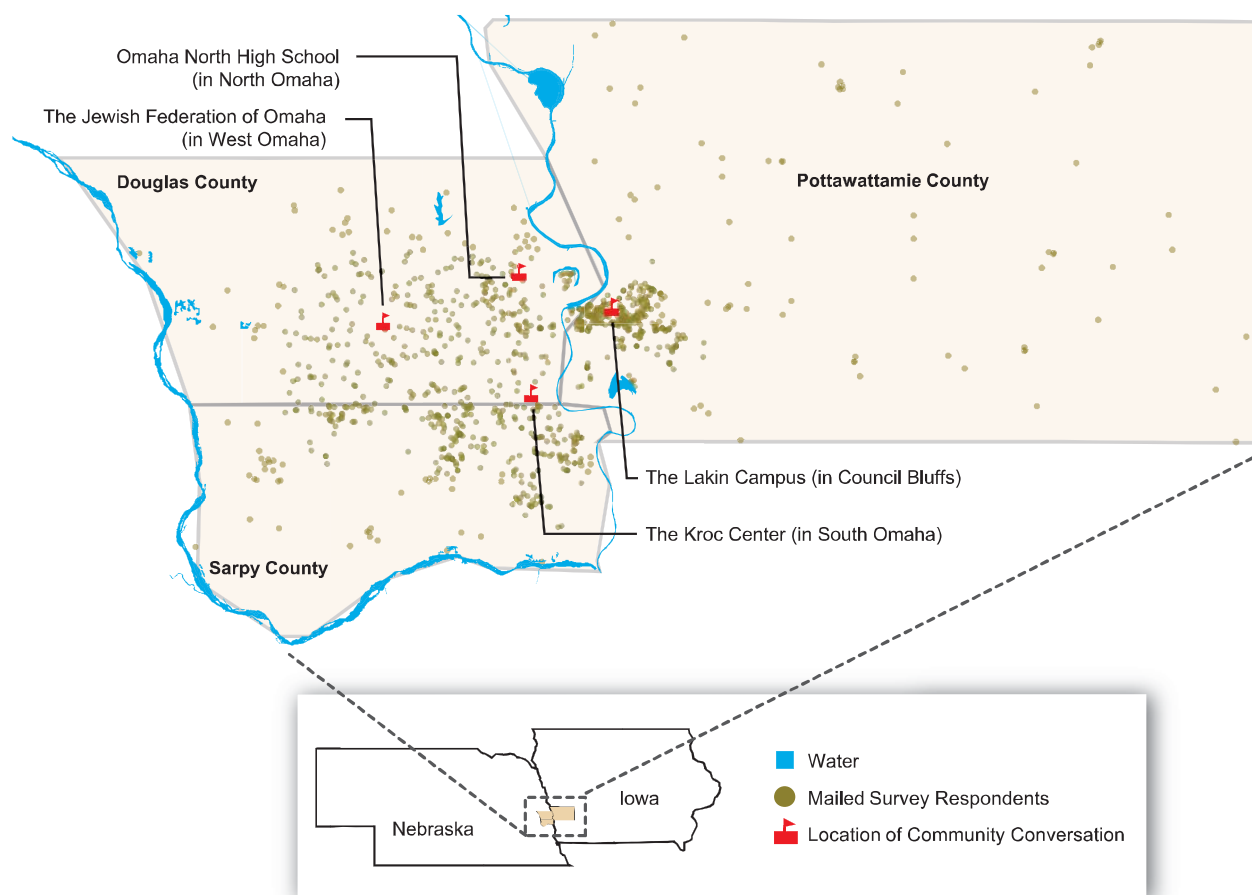
The survey results from the community conversation will be analyzed similarly to the web survey data. The same codebook was also used to analyze the open-ended responses from this survey (see the Appendix).

Specifically, because these participants are not statistically representative of the population in the same way the mailed survey respondents are, their data were handled separately. However, because of the diversity and overall number of participants who completed a survey at the community conversations, their survey data were seriously considered and triangulated with the other data sources to identify overall themes, issues to consider, and recommendations.

The data from the audience polling questions and small and large group discussions was also analyzed using a systematic framework aligned with the topics of this study, and the results were taken into consideration in terms of overall identification of themes and prioritization of issues. The analysis framework is included in the Appendix.

# Table format

For every table in the data book, results will be displayed for sub-groups of respondents based on:

- Totals for each of the three participating counties and the entire region (this is the statistically representative data)
- Totals from the web survey (combining English and Spanish surveys)
- Totals from each of the four community conversations events
- Gender
- Age
- Race
- Language spoken most often at home
- Highest level of education
- Employment status
- Household income (in 2012)
- Household type
- Sexula orientation
- Religious affiliation

The columns in each table correspond to the response options respondents were given on the survey (see Appendix for the survey instrument). If a table presents a survey question with fixed response categories, each column indicates the percentage of respondents who gave that response to the question. Some answer categories are combined because of the low number of responses in those categories. The last column in each row of the table always presents the number of people related to the percentages in that row. Some questions apply only to certain types of respondents (due to skip patterns in the survey). In these cases, the total includes only the respondents for whom the question was applicable.

Some table cells are filled with only a dash. This means that the number of respondents was too small and was therefore suppressed to protect confidentiality, and because the small numbers might not produce reliable population estimates.

Some questions were open-ended, such that respondents wrote their own answers. Responses were grouped according to theme in order to reveal which trends are most notable. In some cases, respondents were allowed to provide more than one answer; for this reason, the total number of responses listed in these tables does not correspond directly to the number of respondents, but rather to the number of answers for a question. The number of respondents can be seen in the title of each table (“N=”). Where fewer than 10 respondents submitted an answer fitting a particular theme, that theme is grouped with other answers in an “Other” category.
